PAINT ME!

In addition to having fun and making many beautiful paintings, we at Frank Bette Center for the Arts (The Bette) are all about selling your works! Here are some ways you can help us.

- When you paint a home or building, **write the address on the back of the painting** and leave one of the slips provided at the end of the artists hand book (also available at FBCA). If we have this information, we can contact the owner to inform them that an artist has painted their property. It may take a follow-up to sell the painting.
- Use the **Paint Me!** list of homes, boats, businesses, favorite views, etc. available the Center. These people might be more inclined to buy a painting if they like it (no promises).
- If a patron sees the painting on your easel and wants to buy it, remember all sales must go through Frank Bette Center for the Arts. This is what you do:

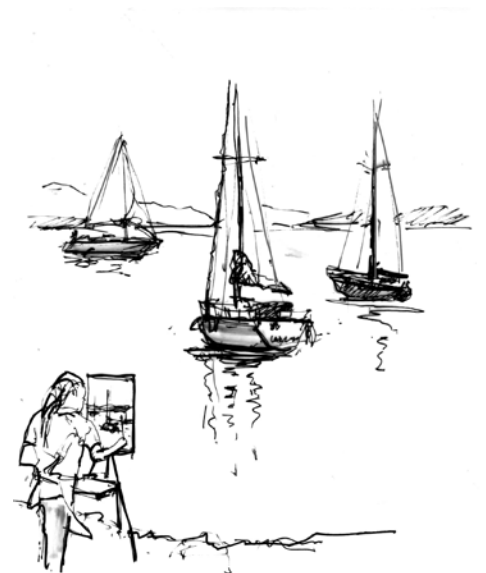
or call **The Bette (510-523-6957)** and see if a volunteer is able to take their credit card over the phone.

When they return with a receipt marked “paid in full” you may give them the painting or if you want to display the painting for judging on Saturday, ask them to pick it up at South Shore Center on Saturday August 1 after 1 pm.

Remember that we still have the **En Plein Air** gallery exhibit August 7 – September 27 to contact potential buyers if we know how to reach them.

A “Paint Me” list will be available at registration.

You are not required to paint the places on the “Paint Me” list.

PLACES OF INTEREST TO PAINT IN ALAMEDA

Alameda is a small island community with terrific water views of San Francisco Bay and one of the largest concentrations of Victorian era homes, Craftsman and other historic buildings. It has many inspiring scenes for you to paint. Here are a few suggestions of places where you may find inspiration.

SHORELINES, BIRDS AND FERRIES

Ballena Bay	On south side of Alameda, with great views of San Francisco and an interesting boat marina. Head west on Central Avenue and turn left on Ballena Blvd.
Crown Beach	A 2.5-mile beach, with sand dunes bordering a bicycle trail. Crab Cove beach is a small beach cove, just east Crown Beach.
Bridges	Fruitvale, Park St. High St. and Bay Farm bridges.
Alameda/Oakland Estuary	The estuary borders the north side of Alameda. A public walkway runs from the foot of Grand Street to Mariner Square and connects with Jean Sweeney Park, providing great waterfront access. Several marinas and yacht clubs are along this stretch.
Barnhill Marina	Houseboat community at the foot of Webster Street.
Bay Farm Island	Bay Farm Island has a large network of man-made lagoons with public pathways running along them. There are wooden bridges and interesting trees.
Water Sports	Kiteboarding at the corner of Shoreline Drive and Westline Drive, hydrofoil and stand-up paddling at Ballena Bay and sailing classes at Encinal Beach.
Elsie Roemer Bird Sanctuary	Located at the intersection of Broadway and Shoreline Drive..
Egret Tree	Behind Harbor Bay Landing Safeway, 867 Island Drive on Bay Farm Island is a walkway — Follow it until you see a large pine tree with the egret nests in it.
Cormorant Tree	Otis Drive across from the Safeway gas station.
Bay Farm Island Ferry terminal	215 Adelphian (Take Island Drive to Mecartney, turn right, go to the end and you will see the parking lot to your left.)
Alameda Ferry Terminal	2990 Main Street (Head northeast on Main Street toward the estuary. The ferry terminal will be on your right.)
Seaplane Lagoon Ferry Terminal	Ferry Point Road (Lincoln Ave to 3rd St., left on Atlantic Ave/Ralph Appezzato Parkway to Ferry Point.)
Art Deco Posey Portal	At the north end of Webster St.
The USS Hornet	A WWII aircraft carrier, is a museum open to the public moored at former Alameda Point, once a naval air station. There are panoramic views of San Francisco and old Navy ships.
Palm Trees	Burbank St. off Central Avenue, between Central and Portola Avenues.
Beautiful Trees	Gibbons Street between High Street and Central Avenue.

PLACES OF INTEREST TO PAINT IN ALAMEDA

HISTORIC BUILDINGS

Victorian Era Homes	The largest concentration is in the central part of the main Island bordered by Willow Street, Lincoln Avenue, Constitution Way, and the lagoons off San Antonio and Clinton Avenues. Some smaller Victorian era home ar located on Mozart Street and Verdi Street between Lincoln Ave. and Santa Clara and on Sherman between Lincoln and Buena Vista Ave.
Spanish-style and Craftsman Homes	The east end, from Park Street to Fernside Drive has a mixture of Spanish-style and Craftsman home. Gibbons Drive cuts diagonally through this tree-lined district.
Historic small-scale cottages	Tregloan Court between Buena Vista Ave. and Eagle Ave.
Bungalow-style homes	The west end, Webster street to Main Street has a collection of some interesting bungalows, churches, and a scattering of Victorian era homes. And on the east end Sterling Ave. and Briggs Ave. between High Street and Fernside Blvd.
Historic buildings	City Hall, Carnegie Library, Alameda High, churches, the original Pan Am Terminal, Alameda Theatre, Alameda Naval Station buildings, as well as iconic shops on Park St. and Webster St. Also, the The Meyers House and Garden, once the home of the designer of the Posey Portal.

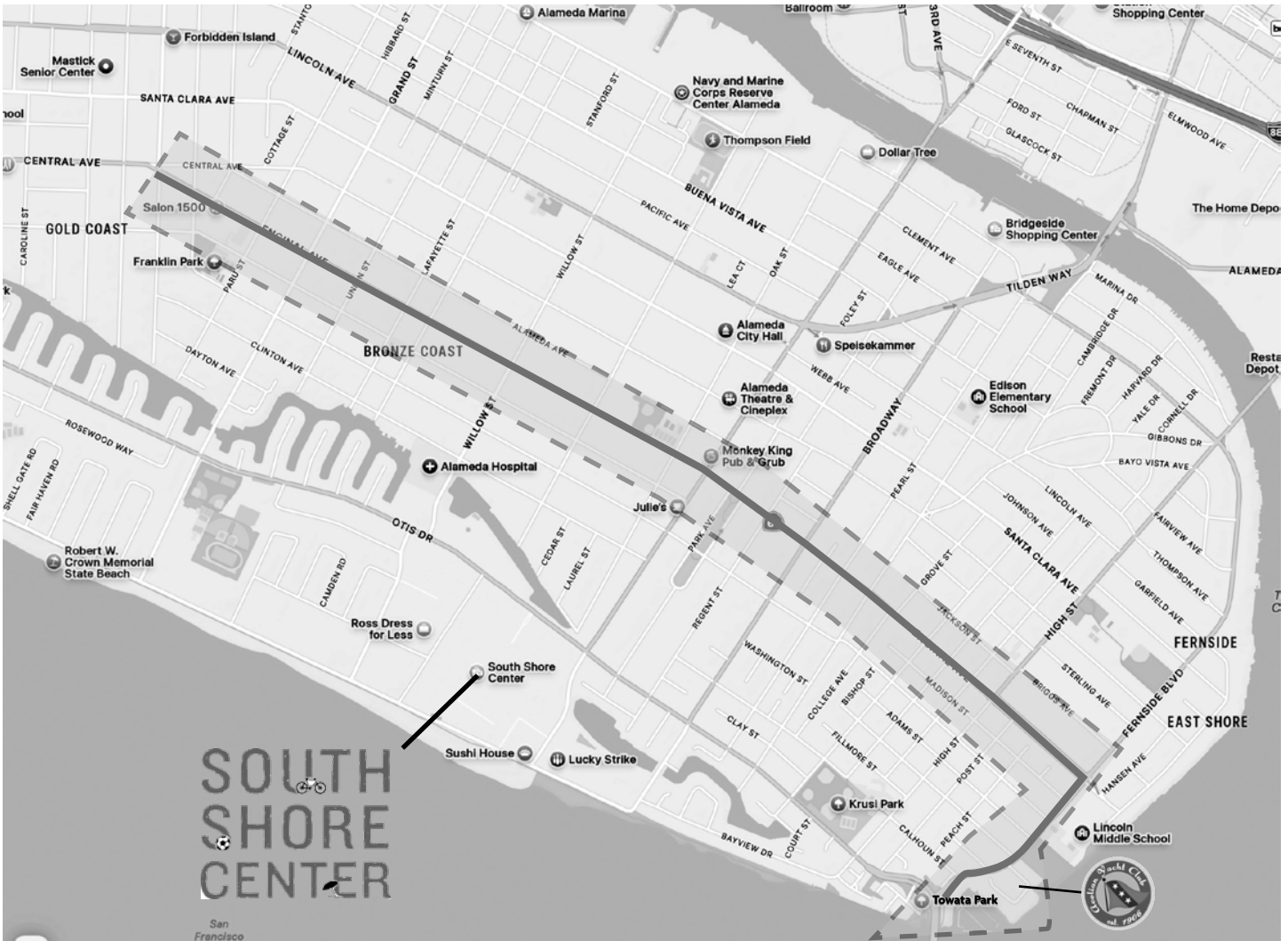

Redwood Square	A charming brick-lined alley, where Alameda Avenue dead ends on the east side of Park Street near Tomatina Restaurant.
Julie's Coffee and Tea Garden	1223 Park Street with a charming garden patio in back.
Farmer's Market	Tuesday and Saturday mornings 9 am to 1 pm on Haight Avenue at Webster.
South Shore Shopping Center	Location of our Saturday sale and exhibit, fronts on Shoreline Dr. and the beach.
Ploughshares	2701 Main Street - native plants and an aviary run by a dove rescue group.

Lincoln Park	From High Street to Fernside Drive between Central and Santa Clara Ave.
Chochenyo Park	Park Avenue between San Jose and Encinal with a bandstand.
Franklin Park	1432 San Antonio Ave. has large trees and playground
Jean Sweeney Open Space Park	is located where Sherman Street changes to Atlantic Ave.
Alameda Point Waterfront Park	located at the end of Ralph Appezato Way.

The quick draw/community artist day, held in the morning of Wednesday, July 29th, will run the length of **Encinal Ave** plus one block each side, from Sherman Ave to Fernside Blvd. It continues along Fernside to Otis Drive. The boundary extends to the shoreline, including the Aeolian Yacht Club, Towata Park.

QUICK DRAW SCHEDULE

WENESDAY, JULY 29, 2026

8:30am 9:00am **ARTISTS SIGN IN** and stamp substrates at Neptune Court (near Daiso) South Shore Center, Otis St. This stamp will be different from the one used during the rest of the week.

9:00am - 12:00pm **ARTISTS PAINT.** The quick draw/community artist day boundaries will run the length of Encinal Ave plus one block each side, from Sherman Ave to Fernside Blvd. It continues along Fernside to Otis Drive. The boundary extends to the shoreline, including the Aeolian Yacht Club, Towata Park and the Bay Farm Island Pedestrian/Bicycle Bridge. On Google Maps it is called: San Leandro Bay Bike Bridge.

We have invited the community to paint en plein air during our quick draw, so don't be surprised to see children and adults painting alongside you. Invite your friends to come paint during the quick draw as a community artist.

11:30am - 12:00pm: **ARTISTS FRAME** and display framed art work at Neptune Court (near Daiso) . All paintings must be labeled with artist's name, painting title, medium and price. We will supply labels and pens.

About 1:00 pm the ballots for Artist Choice Award and Community Artist will be handed out to the artists for voting due by 2:00 pm. Please do not vote for yourself. The winner will be announced at the Awards Ceremony on Saturday.

12:00pm **LUNCH** will be provided.

1:00pm to 5:00pm **DISPLAY ARTWORK FOR SALE.**
Artists are not required to remain with their artwork.

5:00pm to 5:30pm **REMOVE UNSOLD ARTWORK.**
Artwork not removed will be stored without artist access until Saturday, August 2nd. Paintings sold and unsold on Wednesday can be displayed for judging and for sale on Saturday, August 1 at the South Shore Center Exhibit & Sale. Patrons who bought paintings at the Quick Draw sale and left them with the artist to be shown on Saturday for awards, may pick them up with their receipt.

7:30am - 8:30 am

SET UP

Volunteers set up sales tables and easy-ups and put artist's names on displays.

8:30am - 10:00am

SIGN IN AT SOUTH SHORE CENTER

Artists sign in at Sales/Information Booth.

Artists hang their paintings on the displays where they see their name.

All paintings must be framed or have a finished painted edge.

You may display your Quick Draw paintings.

We will provide hanging supplies, labels, etc.

You may hang as many paintings as you can fit on your display area.

You may hang paintings from other events and past years but it must have a special label (details on that label is talked about later)

10:00am - 1:00 pm:

JUDGING

All paintings need to be up by 10 am so the juror can see them!! Your paintings from the Quick Draw that have been already sold may be displayed for judging.

Labels: Include your name, title of painting, medium, and price.

When someone buys one of your paintings, send them, with the painting label, to the sales booth. When they return with the label marked with a red dot, give them the painting if the judging is done. If the judging has not been completed, ask them to return after the awards ceremony.

Set up your easels and paint at your booth if you wish.

Enjoy the day - there are several places to buy lunch at South Shore Center.

Volunteers will watch your display area when you need a short break (15-20 min.)

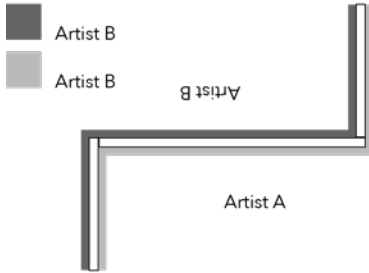

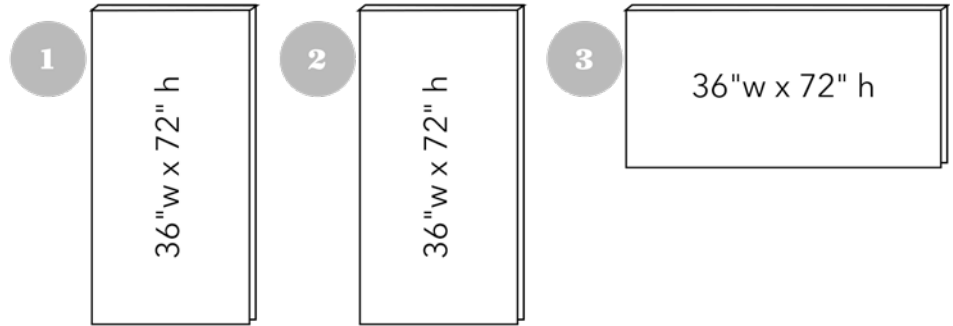
EXHIBITING & SELLING YOUR ARTWORK

DISPLAY UNITS

Display Units



A display unit, from above



One display unit is constructed from three (3) 36"x72" hollow-core doors. Two doors stand vertically, the third is attached horizontally. Each display unit totals 108 sf to be split among 2 artists, for a total of 54 sq ft of display space available per artist.

You may hang as many paintings in your space as you like. When you sell paintings, you may put more up. You may sell paintings from past Plein Air Paintouts but not until after the judging.



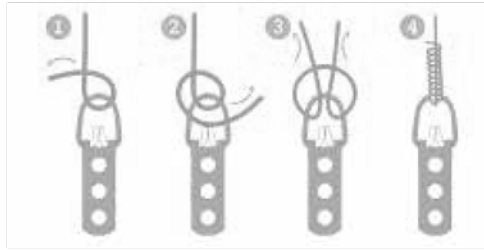
EXHIBITING & SELLING YOUR ARTWORK

HANGING PAINTINGS

We will supply fishing line for hanging your paintings. **Please do not nail into the display units.** There are holes drilled in the top edge of the display units. A nail has been placed into one of these holes to hang your paintings with the fishing line.

JUDGING

Judging will occur between 10 am-1:00 pm

SELLING AT THE EXHIBIT

When a patron wants to purchase a painting, have a volunteer escort the patron to the sales table with the label for the painting. **Do not take paintings to the sales booth.** When the patron returns with the label with a red dot, give them the painting.

ALL SALES MUST GO THROUGH FRANK BETTE CENTER FOR THE ARTS:

Our volunteers will handle the sale and sales tax. This is a fundraiser for us, and we depend on our 40% of the sales price to keep our doors open.

ARTIST'S AGREEMENT

Please accept images of my artwork for consideration in the Frank Bette Plein Air Paintout event and exhibit. I certify that all my entries are original, conceived and created by me.

I agree to participate in the exhibit and sale August 1, 2026.

I agree all sales are subject to a 40% commission to benefit FBCA.

The Bette has my permission to photograph and otherwise reproduce, for promotional purposes, submitted or completed images with appropriate attribution.

I affirm that I have read the entire prospectus and understand, and agree to follow the rules as outlined in the prospectus.

I acknowledge that: (1) All reasonable care will be taken with the artwork (2) FBCA, its officers, employees, volunteers, and representatives are not responsible for the loss or damage to exhibitors' artwork, however caused, and whether in transit or on display and (3) The Bette does not carry loss insurance and strongly recommends participants carry their own loss insurance.

I agree:

1. To forever release the Frank Bette Center for the Arts, its directors, officers, agents and volunteers, from any and all liability to me, my representatives, assigns, heirs, executors and/or next of kin on account of bodily injury, death, or property loss or damage arising from my participation in any Frank Bette Center for the Arts activity, whether caused by the negligence of the Center or its agents or otherwise.

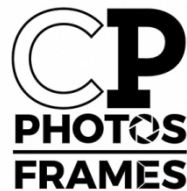
