Entry Instructions and Process

Application Form:

The form is available at the Frank Bette Center for the Arts or on the website, <https://www.frankbettecenter.org/2022-alameda-on-camera-call-for-applications.html>. Please fill it out completely and legibly.

Fees:

A *non-refundable* entry fee is required with the application. The fee is \$5. All entries must be received by January 29 at 5 p.m.

- Applicants may pay the entry fee by check (made payable to Frank Bette Center for the Arts), credit card, or on the FBCA website using PayPal.
- Cash may only be paid at FBCA. Please do not mail cash.

Entries:

Application forms may be submitted as a printed document or electronically.

Quick check list for entries:

- Completed and signed application. Parent or guardian signature is required
- Check/credit card for the entry fee. Payments may also be made on the FBCA web site using PayPal.

Notification of Selected Artists:

- The first 48 youth artist are guaranteed automatic entry with acceptance of their application and entry fee for the 2022 Alameda On Camera February photography event and April through May exhibit.

Artists Are Required to Participate in the 48-Hour Photography Event:

- Attend (or send a proxy) the launch event 6-7 p.m., Friday, February 24. Artists will be assigned a specific geographic area within the city limits of Alameda (determined by a lottery, randomly choosing a piece of an Alameda map).
- Take photographic images ONLY within your assigned geographic area any time, and for any length of time, beginning 9 p.m., Friday February 24, until 9 p.m., Sunday, February 26.
- Submit a contact sheet(s) or .zip file of all images made during the 48-hour photography event to the FBCA Gallery staff by 5 p.m. on March 12. The contact sheet will be placed on file, as a reference document only, should there be any dispute regarding the qualification of the finished artwork submitted to the AOC exhibit.
- Use one or more, or a part of any, of the photographic images, obtained during the 48-hour photography event to create original 5 x 7 photo-based artwork.

Selected Artists Are Required to Submit Artwork to the Alameda On Camera Exhibit:

- Deliver your artwork created with image(s) from the February event to Frank Bette Center for the Arts prior to 5 p.m. on March 26.
- Each artist may submit one or two pieces of artwork. *Each piece is guaranteed to be displayed* in the AOC exhibit.
- Artwork must be printed on 5 x 7 photographic paper. Artwork **must not** be matted or framed. All artwork must have the artist name on the back of the art work.

Sales:

- All artwork must be available for sale at reasonable market prices. FBCA suggest \$20 per 5x7 print.
- The artist authorizes FBCA to sell artwork for the retail price indicated on the inventory record filled out at the time of delivery of artwork.
- The artist will be paid 60% of sales (retail price less 40%). Payments will be sent June 28.

Pick-Up and Return of Exhibited Artwork:

- Artists may not remove artwork from the exhibit prior to its closing at 5 p.m. on Saturday, May 27.
- Artists may pick up unsold artwork on Sunday, May 28, between 11 a.m. and 5 p.m. Artwork left will be considered a donation and become the property of FBCA.

Publicity Release & Liability Disclaimer:

- Application fees are *non-refundable*.
- Any artist not meeting any one of the requirements or deadlines for the 48-hour photography event or Alameda On Camera exhibit will be disqualified, forfeiting the right to participate.
- FBCA reserves the right to use applicants' submitted images, with appropriate acknowledgment, for purposes of publicity, education, and archival records.
- All reasonable care will be taken with artwork. FBCA, its officers, employees, volunteers, and representatives are not responsible for any loss or damage to exhibitors' artwork, however caused, and whether in transit or on display. *FBCA does not carry loss insurance and strongly recommends participants carry their own loss insurance.*

Entry into the "Youth Alameda On Camera" event and exhibit constitutes agreement with all conditions of this prospectus.
